



The Sherman Family



Charles Robert Sherman



- Born 1788 Norwalk, Connecticut- Died 1829 Lancaster, Ohio
- Married Mary Hoyt May 8, 1810, in Norwalk, Connecticut
- Attorney at law
- Ohio Supreme Court Judge 1823-1829
- Father of 11 children

Mary Hoyt Sherman



- Born 1787 Norwalk, Connecticut- Died 1852 Mansfield, Ohio
- Wife of Charles Sherman (1810)
- Mother of 11 including Charles Taylor (1811), Mary Elizabeth (1812), James (1814), Amelia (1816), Julia Ann (1818), William Tecumseh (1820), Lampson Parker (1821), John (1823), Susan Denman (1825), Hoyt (1827), Frances Beecher (1829)

Charles Taylor Sherman




- Born 1811 Norwalk, Connecticut- Died 1879 Cleveland, Ohio
- Ohio University graduate and admitted to the bar
- Mansfield lawyer (1835-1867)
- U.S. district Judge for Northern District of Ohio (1867-1872); Appointed by President Andrew Johnson
- Advocate for agricultural improvements in Richland County
- Married Eliza Jane Williams in 1841 and had several children with notable marriages

General William Tecumseh Sherman



- Born 1820 Lancaster, Ohio- Died 1891 New York, New York
- Raised by Thomas Ewing, a U.S. Senator
- Attended the United States Military Academy at West Point
- Union General known for Capture of Atlanta (1864) and March to the Sea (1864)
- Commanded the Military Division of the Mississippi and later the Army of the United States to oversee reconstruction and military control in the South
- Married Ellen Ewing in 1850 and had eight children

Lampson Parker Sherman



LAMPSON P. SHERMAN


- Born 1821 Lancaster, Ohio- Died 1900
- Worked as an apprentice for the *Cincinnati Gazette*
- Moved to Fort Des Moines in 1849
- Helped draft the city charter for Fort Des Moines in 1851
- City Council Member, Mayor of Des Moines, City Recorder, and City Treasurer
- Worked with his brother at Hoyt Sherman & Company Bank
- Married Susan Rebecca Lawson in 1851 and had eight children
- Lived in the Lapson P. Sherman House beginning in 1888 on Drake University's campus and is now found on the National Historic Registry

John Sherman



- Born 1823 Lancaster, Ohio- Died 1900 Washington D.C.
- Served as a Representative from Ohio 1849-1855
- Served in the U.S. Senate from 1861-1877; 1881-1897
- Secretary of the Treasury 1877-1881 under President Rutherford B. Hayes
- Secretary of State (1897) under President William McKinley
- Sherman Antitrust Act (1890)- prohibits monopiles and anti-competitive business practices
- Married Margaret Cecelia Stweart in 1846 and had eight children

Hoyt Sherman



- Born 1827 Lancaster, Ohio- Died 1904 Des Moines, Iowa
- Moved to Iowa in 1848 to begin a career in banking, commerce, and law when it was Fort Des Moines
- State legislator for Iowa
- Postmaster Appointment in 1861 by President Taylor and later appointed as Pay Master by President Lincoln
- Founded and operated local banks including Hoyt Sherman & Company Bank
- Married Sara Elvira Moulton in 1855 and had five children
- Home is now on the Historic National Registry (1977) and serves as the home for DMWC as well as the first public art gallery in Des Moines and historic theater

Sara Moulton Sherman



- Born 1837 Granger, Ohio- Died 1887 (49 years old) Des Moines, Iowa
- Married Hoyt Sherman on December 25, 1855
- Mother of Frank Allen, Adeline, Charles Moulton, Arthur Hoyt, and Helen

Adeline Sherman Wiborg



- Born 1859 Des Moines, Iowa- Died 1917 New York, New York
- Married to Frank Bestow Wiborg, owner of “The Dunes” estate in East Hampton and partner of Ault & Wiborg Company of Cincinnati, ink manufacturing in 1882
- Mother of three daughters Mary, Olga, and Sara

Mary Hoyt Wiborg



- Born 1888 Cincinnati, Ohio- Died 1964
- Granddaughter of Hoyt and Sara Sherman
- Daughter of Adeline Sherman Wiborg & Frank Wiborg
- Playwright and arts sociality
- 1922 play *Taboo* starring Paul Robeson
- Sister of Sara Murphy and Olga Wiborg; sisters called her “Hoytie”
- Lived in Paris and helped with war efforts during World War I and II

Sara and Gerald Murphy



Sara

- Born 1883 Cincinnati, Ohio- Died 1975 Arlington, Virginia
- Granddaughter (Sara) of Hoyt & Sara Sherman
- Daughter of Adeline Sherman Wiborg & Frank Wiborg
- Socialite and high-society member in New York City
- Mother of three
- Engaged to Gerald in 1915

Gerald

- Born 1888 Boston, Massachusetts- Died 1964 East Hampton, New York
- Mark Cross Company, luxury leather goods
- Painted 1921-1929
- Escaped from their families to Paris where they joined elite social circles including Scott Fitzgerald, Ernest Hemingway, Pablo Picasso, Cole Porter, and more

Helen Sherman Griffith



- Born 1873 Des Moines, Iowa- Died 1961 Saynderstown, Rhode Island
- Daughter of Hoyt and Sara Sherman
- Married William Ogesby Griffith in 1896
- Autor of the *Letty Grey* children's book series
- Visited the DMWC at Hoyt Sherman Place in 1914
